A new call for proposals under the Community Sport for All Initiative (CSAI) has been launched. The CSAI seeks to remove barriers and increase sport participation for under-represented groups, in particular, low -income people, persons with disabilities, seniors, newcomers. Black. Indigenous, racialized and 2SLGBTQI+ communities.

\$15 million over two years will be provided for the CSAI, \$5 million in 2024-25 and \$10 million in 2025-26.

National organizations, or those capable of delivering projects across multiple provinces and/or territories are invited to apply.

The deadline to submit proposals is December 23, 2024.

Financialization of Housing - The first consultation seeks input to confront the financialization of housing by large corporate investors. Housing should not be speculative assets for investors.

Feedback on ways to restrict the purchase and acquisition of existing single-family homes by very large corporate investors is sought from Canadians and stakeholders until December 19, 2024

Heads Up: Kids Help Phone Funding



Democracy in ACTION Legislation before the House

GST Vacation -

To help Canadians as we enter the holiday season, the government will be introducing legislation in Parliament that would provide for a two-month Goods and Services Tax (GST) break for groceries and holiday essentials.

The proposal is for GST be fully and temporarily relieved on holiday essentials, like groceries, restaurant meals, drinks, snacks, children's clothing, and gifts, from December 14, 2024, to February 15, 2025. This tax break aims to make a meaningful difference for Canadians by making essentially all food GST free.
