More money in your pocket: A TAX BREAK FOR ALL CANADIANS

From December 14, 2024 till February 15, 2025, we're giving a tax break to all Canadians. With a GST/HST exemption across the country, Canadians will be able to buy essentials like groceries, snacks, and kids clothing - all tax-free.

This new tax break will apply to:

- Prepared foods, including vegetable trays, pre-made meals and salads, and sandwiches.
- Restaurant meals, whether dine-in, takeout, or delivery.
- Snacks, including chips, candy, and granola bars. Beer, wine, cider, and pre-mixed alcoholic beverages below 7 per cent
- ABV. Children's clothing and footwear, car seats, and diapers.
- Children's toys, such as board games, dolls, and video game consoles.
 - Books, print newspapers, and puzzles for all ages.
- Christmas trees.

Doubling of Loan Limit under the Secondary Suite Loan Program The loan limit under the Secondary Suite Loan Program is being doubled to \$80,000 as part of the 2024 Fall Eco

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nomic Statement. Early next year, homeowners will be able to access 15-year, 2 percent interest loans to help cover the cost of turning unused space into a rental apartment, laneway home, or in-law suite. Starting in January, homeowners will also have more mortgage refinancing options to build secondary suites.
